Many Blessings in this New Year!


Our prayer for each of you in this new year is for a closer and stronger walk with God and Christ Jesus.




Chrysalis News

Gatherings usually take place every 4th Friday **unless** there is a Walk. We also won't have a Gathering on the 4th Friday in March in observance of **Good Friday.**


We meet at White Plains United Methodist Church in Cary, NC, 7:30PM to 9:00PM.

An Important Message About Sponsorship

The intent of the Walk to Emmaus is to develop and strengthen the leadership in the local church. It equips individuals with some different tools to aid their continued growth in grace and toward becoming the persons God wants them to be, whether serving in visible or invisible roles in the Body of Christ. One of the most effective ways to promote the Walk to Emmaus comes through your living out the changes the experience had made in our own lives. If you expect to interest others, they must see signs of revitalization in your life and your response to God's call to discipleship. Only then can you expect them to listen when you tell them about the weekend.

The strength of any Emmaus community is a direct result of the community's recruiting practices. If the community is committed to recruiting strong church leaders for the purpose of strengthening the local church, the community will be a strong, vital force in the renewal movement. Emmaus is designed to spiritually renew church members, who, in turn Christianize their environments. The church is a vital part of this renewal effort. If strong church members are recruited to attend Emmaus

Walks, the Emmaus community will provide authentic spiritual renewal. On the other hand, if the Walk to Emmaus is looked upon as a hospital where every human ill can be cured, it will have a weakening effect on the entire community.

Sponsorship is the most important job in the Emmaus community and carries with it a great number of responsibilities. Sponsorship requires extensive prayer, diligent thought, and careful planning and follow-up. The Board of Directors of the Heart of Carolina Emmaus community is committed to equipping each member to be good sponsors. In the coming year, you will be receiving more information regarding wise and unwise sponsorship, why you would choose to sponsor, whom to sponsor, and what is required of a sponsor.

In early 2006, each sponsor will be required to complete a training session to better equip them for this role. The Training committee is working to develop a short, informative session that will fully equip you with the skills needed in taking responsibility for each pilgrim God places in your care in the most important of "Behind the Scenes" roles.

Agape Reminder

Agape that is brought for a walk should *NOT* have anyone's personal name on it, but instead should be from a reunion group, "sister or brother in Christ" or it can be given anonymously. Agape that is distributed is done

so as an act of love and is never done as an act to glorify oneself. Also, please remember that due to the addition of the board representative to the team, your agape amounts in the future should include 61 pieces for each walk.

Sponsor Letters Made Simple!

Agape letters are a very important part of every Emmaus Walk. The following guidelines should help sponsors as they collect letters for their pilgrim.

Each pilgrim should receive 12 letters on Sunday afternoon. These are the letters that the SPONSOR has asked family and friends to write. After collecting the 12 letters, the sponsor should write Sponsor or S #1 through # 12 in the postage stamp area of the envelopes. This will ensure that the main 12 letters are included in the packet. All other letters received will be given to the sponsor to give to the pilgrim after closing.

Non-sponsor letters are those written by church friends, team members, etc. that were not requested by the sponsor. If the sponsor does not collect 12 letters, enough non-sponsor letters will be included in the packet to insure that each pilgrim gets 12 letters.

During send-off and throughout the weekend, boxes marked sponsor and non-sponsor will be in the Agape room. The boxes will also be at the church during

Candlelight. Please deposit your letters in the appropriate box.

Everyone please note: there are a lot of moms, dads, Uncle Mikes, and grandpas on each Walk, so make sure that the pilgrim's first and last names are on each envelope. If the recipient cannot be identified, there is no way to get the letter to the intended pilgrim.

Need Some Ideas for Agape? Check these out!

- *Lighters or matches with a candle with the message "You are the Light of the world."
- *Mending kits with the message, "God fixes everything." (mini tool kits would work, too!)
- *One-inch wooden disc with clothespin glued to front and a piece of magnet tape on back of clothespin. Decorate disc with a sticker or leave plain: "God can hold it all together!"
- *Little notebooks or note pads: "Write this down: Jesus Loves You!"
- *Seed packages: "Grow in Christ."
- *Emory board or small piece of sand paper: "Jesus can smooth away all our rough edges!"
- *Diaper pin: "God can change even the worst of things."
- *Earth magnet or pins or erasers: "Jesus: Don't leave earth without Him!"
- *Magnifying glass: "See everything clearly with Christ" or "Let your faith be magnified." Or "If they dusted your Bible for fingerprints, would they find any fresh ones? Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. Psalm 119:105."
- *Emergency rain ponchos: "When life gives you rain, God gives you rainbows!"

- *Yo-yos: "God will be there though all your ups and downs."
- * Rock: "Jesus is the rock" and draw a cross on the rock.
- * Penny hot glued to a card: "Jesus just makes 'cents'."
- *Foam heart glued to a card: "Give your heart to Jesus." Or any heart verse.
- *Hand held fans. Cut a large heart from card stock or other paper and tape this to a pencil. Print on heart before cutting and taping: "Join the Jesus fan club."
- *Finger traps: "Submit to Christ and be free." You may want to explain on the card that the finger trap will hold you as long as you struggle and pull.
- *Teddy bear stickers or very small (1/2 inch) teddy bears or gummy bears: "God's love bears all."
- *Key chain: "Let Jesus be the key to your life" or "Put God in the driver's seat."
- *Disposable razors: "God will get you out of even the hairiest situations."
- * Small back scratchers: "God always has a hand for you!" (Agape ideas taken from the North Indiana Emmaus Community's website at www.niemmaus.com.)
